It is embarrassing to welcome a newcomer to the Accounts Receivable Group and congratulate him for having the best performance at the same time; however, both are in order for Dick Johnson of Evanston, who not only did the best job, but was the only one who accumulated positive points during July.

As I stated in my memo of July 19, 1972, July would be a real test for collections; well, we failed! As a result, the 30-60 and 60-90 have increased substantially, in fact, some locations are back where they started three (3) months ago, or worse. What is even more concerning, and you should be aware of, is that August's collections as of this date are running 30% behind July. The balance of this month will require real effort if we are to reverse the trend of the last 45 days.

Two other individuals deserve mentioning; John Lunquist, of Minneapolis, who attained the best performance during June and held this position somewhat in July; and Ken Van Brunt, of Lyndhurst, who, although he has not yet attained first position, has been tracking steady improvement.
